



Dr. Janet Martha Blatny is the Research Director of the Total Defense division at the Norwegian Defence Research Establishment (FFI) and has been a member of FFI's Executive Leadership since 2014. She is an Honorary Visiting Professor at the Institute for Security Science and Technology at Imperial College London, and she is a Special Advisor for NATO's Chief Scientist at the Office of Chief Scientist, NATO Science and Technology Organization (STO) in Brussels.

She has extensive scientific and technological experience within national defense and security covering resilience, civil-military collaboration, foreign information manipulation and interference, and cognitive warfare, and she specializes in CBRN and biotechnology. She has more than 30 years of experience within academic and applied research for military and civilian communities and stakeholders.

Blatny was the Chair of the NATO STO Human Factors and Medicine Panel from 2021 to 2023 and the Vice Chair from 2019 to 2021. She has coordinated and chaired several international research projects, mostly within EDA, EU, and NATO. She attended the Senior Executive Course at the Norwegian Defence University College in 2009 and the NATO Defense College Senior Course in 2024. Blatny received her PhD in Biotechnology Engineering in 1997 from the Norwegian University of Science and Technology.
